



## **The Schulhof Award**

*Lary Schulhof, former Muncie Burriss swimmer, began his rise to swimming fame in 1957 swimming for Coach Korsgaard as a freshman where he finished third place in the 150 yard individual medley. In 1958 he won the first 100 yard butterfly state championship in a 58.8. 1959 saw Lary repeat in the fly with a new state record, 56.7, and state runner-up in the 150 IM. In 1960 he won the butterfly for third time in another state record time of 54.7 which also established a national record. Lary also swam on the medley relay team that was state runner-up for the Owls in 1960.*

*Lary decided to continue his education at Indiana University, where he trained under legendary coach Doc (James) Councilman. Lary was All-American and all Big Ten four times. At the 1962 NCAA Championships, Lary earned a 5<sup>th</sup> place finish in the 100 butterfly and a 4<sup>th</sup> place finish in the 200 butterfly. However, that same year, he won the National USA Championship 200 butterfly. During his senior season, at the 1963 NCAA Championships, he finished 4<sup>th</sup> the 100 butterfly and 5<sup>th</sup> in the 200 yard butterfly.*

*After Lary completed his senior year with the Hoosiers, he decided to continue training for the 1964 Tokyo Olympics. At the Olympic Trials, he qualified to compete in the 400 meter freestyle relay. That relay received the Gold medal at those games. Lary received his A.B. and M.D. degrees from Indiana University, where he completed more than six years of postgraduate neurosurgical training, including a year of pediatric neurosurgery training at Riley Children's Hospital and a fellowship in Cambridge, England. He studied micro-neurosurgery in Zurich, Switzerland and in Gainesville, Florida. Dr. Schulhof specializes in spinal surgery. He currently resides in Asheville, North Carolina.*

*In 1965, the city of Muncie and the Schulhof family began honoring the dedication and commitment of swimmers with an annual award to swimmers in Delaware County. The recipients are nominated by their coaches and one parent, who are appointed by the coaches. The criterion for this award is setting an excellent example in leadership, volunteerism and commitment to the swimming community. The award is presented during the Muncie Mayor's Meet (a variety of names has occurred with this meet—Delaware County Meet, Jaycees, etc..) held at historic Tuhey park pool. The award was not presented from 1980-1983 and 2009-2011 due to budgetary constraints, issues with the pool and a brief withdrawal of support by the Muncie mayor's office in 2010, this meet was not held in Muncie or was outright cancelled. It resumed in the summer of 2012 in a very new and improved 50 meter Tuhey pool.*

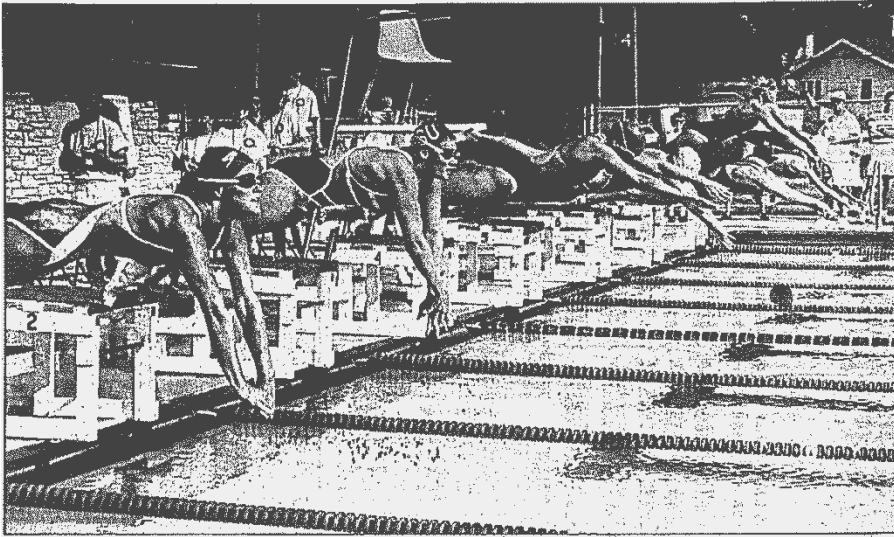

■ 15-19: Renee Rowlett (Nassau) and Josh Dobbs (Catalina).

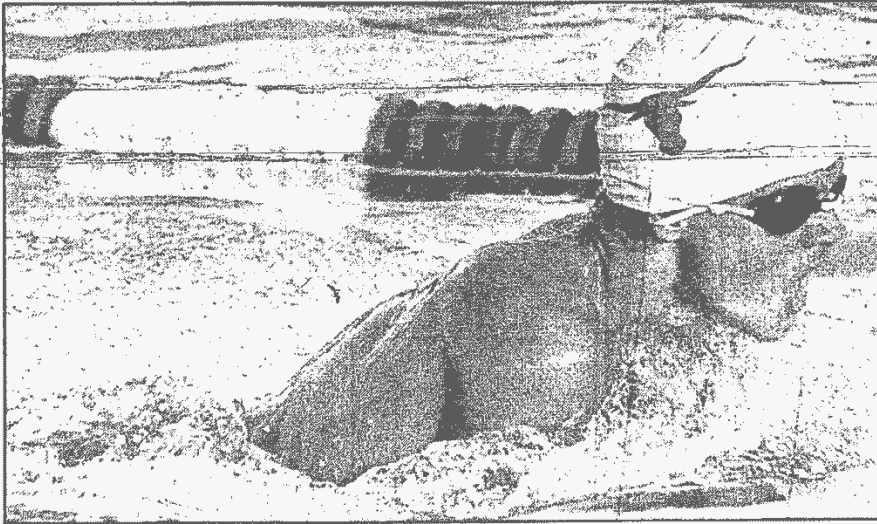
Rowlett, McCormick, Swander and Matthew Bowman all won six events.

competitors.

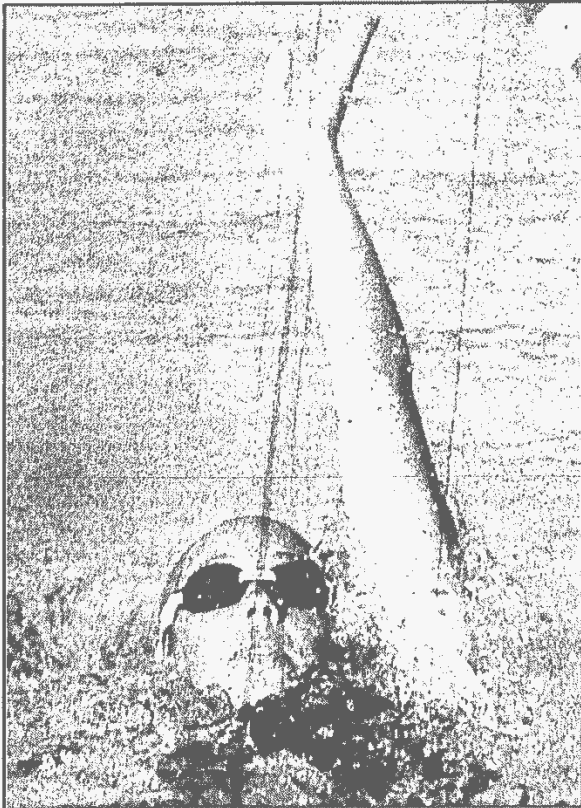

## Swim Meet Expected to Draw 200

Eighth annual Jaycees Delaware County swimming meet will get under way at 1 p.m. Sunday at Tuhey Pool. Qualifications are scheduled for Saturday and finals will start at 1 p.m. Sunday.

Approximately 200 swimmers are expected to take part in competition in five age groups. Groups are eight years and under, nine, and 10 years, 11 and 12, 12 and 14, and 15, 16, and 17 years.

HIGH POINT trophies will be awarded in all divisions and for the first time this year the Schulhof Trophy will be presented to the outstanding boy or girl swimmer in the meet. The selection will be made by a three-man panel on the basis of ability, performance, and attitude.

The new trophy is sponsored by Dr. and Mrs. Schulhof, Muncie, whose sons, Tuck and Larry, were outstanding swimmers. The trophy may be retained for one year.

Gold, silver, and bronze medals will be awarded for the first three places in each event, with ribbons for fourth, fifth, and sixth. Each contestant will be permitted to compete in three events.

Rex Rudicek, Muncie Burris, net coach, will be the starter. Joe Allardt will serve as meet director.

The public is invited and there will be no admission charge either Saturday or Sunday.

# Jaycee Swim Meet Is Set

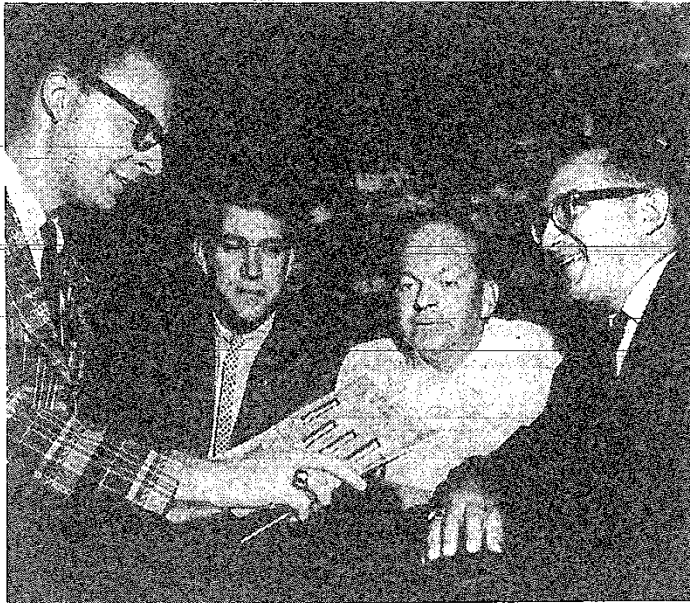
Joe Allardt, chairman of the fifth annual Jaycee Delaware County Swim Meet, announced today that the meet will be held July 17 and 18 at Tuhey Pool.

Allardt pointed out that this event, which annually attracts almost 300 participants, will be held a month earlier than in past years.

He explained: "We have felt for several years that mid-August was too late to hold the swim meet, but have had difficulty moving the date forward because of the transition period within our club caused by the July 1 administration change. This year we set a precedent when our current Board of Directors approved the project on the recommendation of the incoming officers, so we are able to get an earlier start and hold the meet when the swimming should be at its peak."

### DAYTIME SCHEDULE FOR THE FIRST TIME

He said the swim meet is to be held on Saturday and Sunday afternoons, rather than on weekday evenings as in the past. Allardt listed as reasons for this change: The entry list has grown to such proportions that it has caused the meet to run beyond the bedtime of many of the younger participants; the danger of colds and pulled muscles are lessened by conducting the event during the warmer daylight hours; the lane markings will be more visible, so the chance of swimmers getting hurt on the pool walls will be greatly reduced, and daylight should contribute to the comfort and vision of the spectators and encourage a larger audience.

Tuhey Pool has again been selected for the site primarily because of its central location. It also has adequate parking and bleachers for the spectators and is physically large enough to run six lane heats, so the meet will progress quite rapidly, Allardt said.

Details on the rules, age divisions, schedule of events and prizes will be announced, but Allardt pledged: "This will be the largest and best Delaware County Swim Meet ever held."

Assisting him in planning the meet will be Dick Nolan, registration; Jack Park, manpower; Ken Baker, awards; and Bob Henninger, publicity.

# Perrin Sets 3 Records

Tom Perrin, a young man who has this swimming business pretty well figured out, bagged the lion's share of honors Sunday as the eighth annual Jaycee Delaware County meet was brought to a close at Tuhey Pool.

**THE TWO-DAY** affair brought out more than 200 swimmers and big audiences. Joe Allardt was meet director.

Perrin, who competes in the 13 and 14 age group, was awarded the Schulhof Trophy, presented for the first time this year to the meet's outstanding swimmer on the basis of ability, performance, and attitude. Posted by Dr. and Mrs. M. G. Schulhof, the trophy was handed Perrin by Lary Schultof, Indiana University and Olympic swimmer who served as judge of the Sunday session.

Well-taught and well-conditioned swimmers reviewed meet record books and Perrin did his share. Limited to three events by the rules, he won them all and established new records in all three. In two events, the freestyle (.58:3) and butterfly (1:02), his records were better than the best times of the boys 15-17 age group. His time of 2:28.7 in the individual medley, also a record, equalled the 15-17 time of Jerry Green.

Perrin also won a trophy for being high point swimmer in the 13-14 division. Ten high-point trophies were awarded.

Wes Andy Sheridan, a consistent winner in her age group, won the high-point trophy for girls eight years of age and under and the boys' winner at that age was Steve Duncan.

Carol Duncan and William Gruppen won the trophies in the 9-10 group and Mary Sheridan and Bob Maryann were best in the 11-12 years bracket. In the 13-14 group Perry and Anne Miller were winners.
